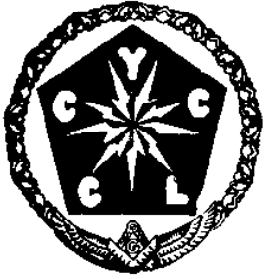
There being no further business, the College closed in form at 2:52 P.M.
